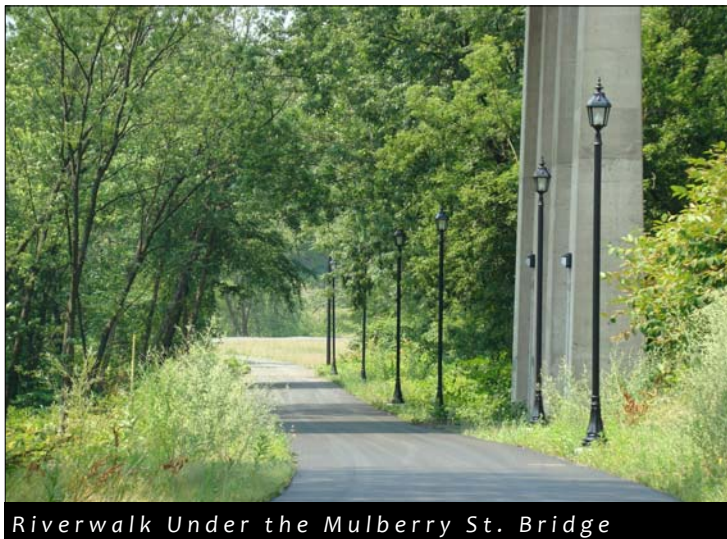
# DOWNTOWN SCRANTON RIVERWALK



## Features

- Gateway to the forty-mile Lackawanna River Heritage Trail, a recreational trail along the Lackawanna River from Union Dale to Pittston.
- Runs from Olive Street to North Seventh Avenue, Scranton. Length is slightly under one mile.
- Connects to the Central New Jersey (CNJ) Rail-Trail section from 7th Avenue to Elm Street in South Scranton. The two trail sections create a route approximately two miles long.
- Offers a paved asphalt surface, and is fully accessible for wheelchairs and strollers.
- Conveniently located close to downtown Scranton for residents, the business community, and visitors to the area.
- Open to walkers, runners, dog-walkers, and bicyclists. Motorized vehicles are not allowed.
- Features a spur trail connecting the main trail to Scranton High School. This provides a safe route for students traveling to and from school and their neighborhoods.
