# **About Us**

The Lackawanna Heritage Valley National and State Heritage Area is a partnership of government, business, civic organizations, and individuals dedicated to the development of the region's historic, cultural, economic, and natural resources through preservation, education, and promotion of our heritage. LHV is managed by the Lackawanna Heritage Valley Authority (LHVA).

### Mission & Goals

The mission of the Lackawanna Heritage Valley is to facilitate community action in the preservation, promotion and development of the region's history, cultural heritage, and natural resources. LHV's goals include:

- Telling the story of the Lackawanna Heritage Valley.
- Facilitating partnerships.
- Preserving and enhancing the physical character and economic vitality of the communities in the Lackawanna Valley.
- Improving the visitor experience.
- Reconnecting people and communities to the Lackawanna River.



# 2017 Financial Overview

### **Project Support**

Lackawanna Heritage Valley (LHV) funds projects that fulfill its mission and goals. These projects stimulate the region's economic development, enhance tourism initiatives, strengthen the capacity of community organizations, and increase the quality of life for area residents.

In 2017 Lackawanna Heritage Valley expended \$1,597,569 in total funding for new and ongoing initiatives. Of this, LHV awarded \$22,198 through 21 grants to partner organizations.

LHV allocated \$1,575,371 to support Heritage Area projects. Of this, \$1,423,921 funded the planning, development, improvement and maintenance of the Lackawanna River Heritage Trail. The total cost for all projects, including matching funds by partners, was \$1,910,673.

### **Economic Investment**

Lackawanna Heritage Valley requires a dollar-for-dollar (1:1) match for all of its grant awards. In 2017, LHV granted \$22,198 to support projects, programs and events. The total cost of 2017 partner projects was \$335,204, creating a leveraging ratio of 1:16.



### Cycling

Bike Share - Now in its third season, this free bike share program is designed to encourage the exploration of the trail in a whole new way. Six free rental sites are located throughout the City of Scranton. The program will be more inclusive for individuals with mobility concerns. Hand-cycles and recumbent cycles will be available to borrow at LHV offices and the University of Scranton Kevin P. Quinn Athletic Complex. Coming soon to Carbondale in 2018.

Heritage Trailblazer Bike Club - Riders of all skill levels traveled along sections of trail in Scranton, the Mid Valley, and Carbondale, enjoying the natural beauty of the region along the way. The club hosted 21 group rides in 2017.





### All About Monarchs


Educational program for all ages about the life-cycle and conservation of the monarch butterfly population. Held at the Nay Aug Avenue Natural Play Area in Scranton.
